## **TRANSPORT** - What am I?

I can be used by people to go to work or to the shops. I use the road. I am usually big enough to carry about four people. I have an engine and I use petrol, diesel or electricity to power me.

I am very big and long and carry people and goods. I have wings and can fly to different countries around the world. I am also used to fly to places within a country.

I travel on the water, usually the sea. I have a specially trained crew. I rescue people in emergencies on the water. I am designed to be very steady in rough water.

I am powered by an engine, but I only have two wheels. I have no weather protection for my rider, so wrap up warm. You must wear a crash helmet if you use me. I can carry a passenger behind the rider or sometimes I have a small sidecar attached to me.

I am quite a large commercial boat. I am used to carry people and cars across the water. I am used on rivers and seas. People pay to travel on me. A popular destination is The Isle of Wight! I am used to help people carry things for work, maybe, or deliver parcels. There is usually room for someone to sit next to the driver. I use the road. I am bigger than a car, but have a similar engine.

I am a large vehicle that travels along local roads, stopping frequently to pick up and set down passengers. Passengers have to pay to use me. I can be a single or double decker. Famous red double deckers can be seen in London.

I travel on tracks and can go very fast over land. I am also used underground. Passengers get on board me at stations. They travel in my carriages. I usually have a driver, but in London, for example I am known on one track not to have a driver! I was powered by steam but now its more popular to be electricity.
